
We act in the areas of environment and climate change; food security and local economy; access to basic social services; citizenship and human rights.


OUR TEAM



FIELD PROJECTS

Oikos works and manages its activity through projects contracted under national and international tenders. The European Union, Portuguese Cooperation and other international donors are the main sources of funding. Oikos acts directly and with a wide network of local partners in socially and environmentally vulnerable communities on several continents.



PUBLIC POLICY INFLUENCE

We promote policy advocacy actions, such as study and analysis, public information, consultation, dialogue, pressure or denunciation, accompanied by alternative proposals for action, giving a voice to the most vulnerable among policy makers. The goal is to monitor and contribute to public policies that promote social justice and sustainable development.



SOCIAL BUSINESS

Oikos has sought to create social businesses, investing in solutions with social impact that make local economic activities sustainable and lasting, providing the beneficiary populations with the means to continue the action that benefits them and to remunerate the investing partners.



PROVISION OF SERVICES

Oikos provides consulting, training and networking services to ensure that the social and environmental dimensions (integrated with the economic one) of any investment are met.



AWARENESS PROGRAMS

Involvement of educational communities and empowerment of social organizations, through different forms of communication and formal and non-formal education.



SOCIAL MOBILIZATION CAMPAIGNS

Awareness-raising, mobilization, training, and production of (in)formative materials aimed at involving civil society, including children, youth, and vulnerable groups, in the proposition of public policies that promote equity and social justice, sustainable development, and respect for human rights.








PRACTICAL EXAMPLES OF THE INTERVENTION OIKOS

ENVIRONMENT AND CLIMATE CHANGE



ESTABLISHMENT OF A NETWORK OF MARINE PROTECTED AREAS IN SÃO TOMÉ E PRÍNCIPE

Establish a participatory fisheries management and conservation system, prioritizing community involvement in an ecosystem governance approach to planning.(Jul. 2018 - Dec. 2023)

- 76% of São Tomé residents report positive attitudes towards marine biodiversity conservation;
- 3 projects initiated to stimulate the creation of alternative established employment opportunities;
- 56,4% of residents in project communities report income activities that do not depend on marine resources.
- In Príncipe, data collection on community-led fishing landings has increased from 10 to 15.

FOOD SECURITY AND LOCAL ECONOMY

SUPPORT FOR THE RECOVERY OF THE AGRICULTURAL SECTOR AS A WAY TO CONTRIBUTE TO FOOD SECURITY FOR THE POPULATIONS MOST AFFECTED BY CYCLONES IDAI AND KENNETH, MOZAMBIQUE

Promote development and reduce poverty for families and communities affected by cyclones, train populations in techniques to reduce the impact of future calamities.


(Feb. 2020 - Sept. 2022)

- 983 CSO and community leaders (86% men and 14% women) improve their skills on advocacy and promotion of access and sustainable use of natural resources;
- 24 community plans and agendas produced in a participatory way for natural resource management;
- 31 created/revitalized and active natural resource management committees;
- 501 students and teachers involved in community awareness actions.

CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPPING OF THE CENTRO MÉDICO PSICOPEDAGÓGICO "LA EDAD DE ORO" - HAVANA, CUBA

Improve services and quality of life for residents of the Psychopedagogical Medical Center "The Golden Age". (Apr. 2009 - Dec. 2015)

- Construction from the ground up of a new building with capacity to
 accommodate 186 resident patients, in addition to the outpatient clinic and with
 specific areas for education and treatment physiotherapy, psycho-pedagogy,
 labor education, infirmary, and pharmacy rooms as well as with recreational
 areas, green spaces, and auxiliary services.
- It has become a reference unit for Cuba and countries in the region.

CITIZENSHIP AND HUMAN RIGHTS



PROMOTING GOVERNANCE AND RESTITUTION OF CIVIL SOCIETY RIGHTS, CENTRAL AMERICA

Promoting civil society governance for the prevention, restitution of rights and prohibition of torture and ill-treatment of women, youth and LGBTI people.

(Jan. 2021 - Apr. 2024)

- 82% of victims know how to identify their innate human rights and 63% know how to activate complaint and denunciation mechanisms;
- 80% of the partners' technical staff improved their capacity to respond to and protect local human rights defenders;
- 4 forums on torture and ill-treatment of women, youth and LGBTIQ+ people held (2 national and 2 regional).
